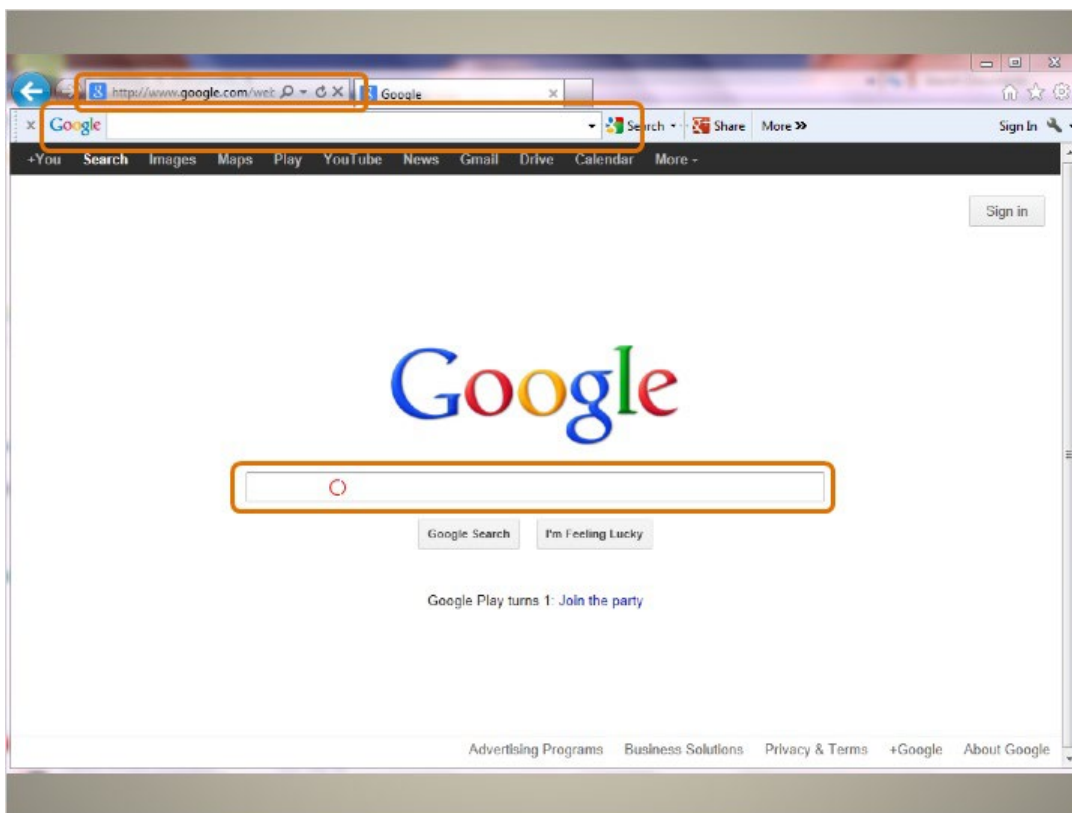


Basic Web Search

2.1 Google Homepage

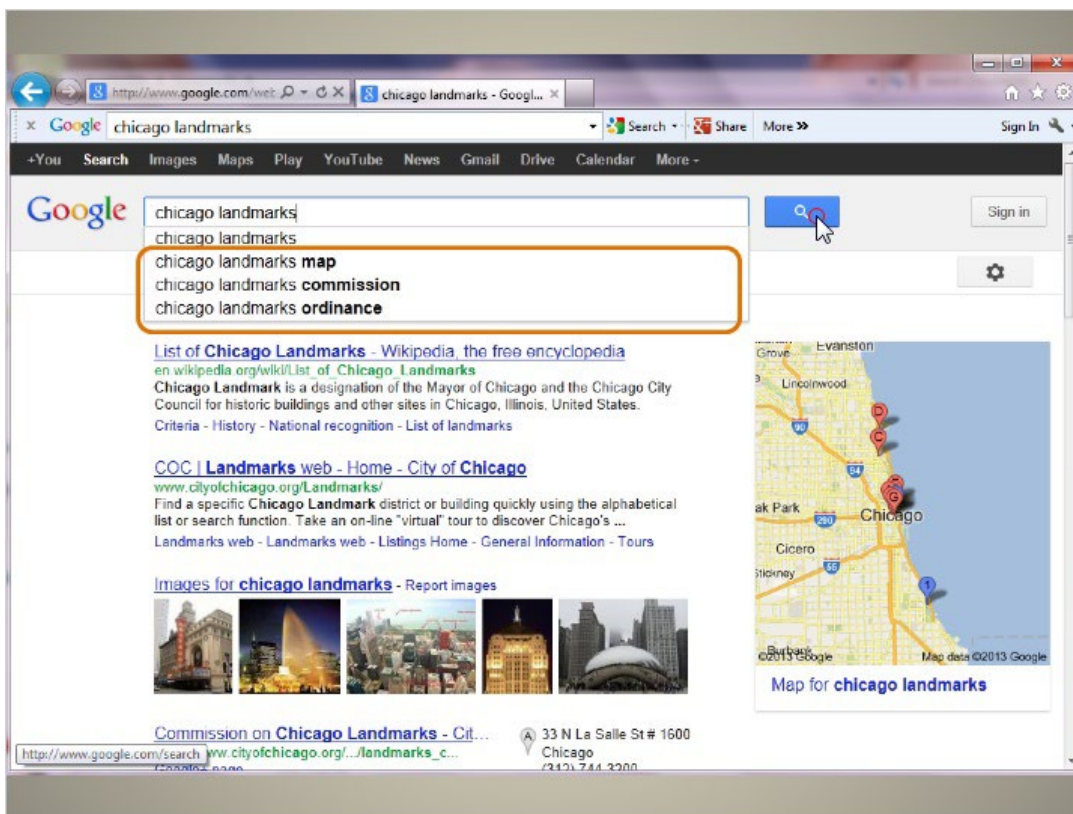


Michelle starts her search by going to Google's website.

Another quick way to do a search is to type her key words in the Internet browser's address bar or search bar.

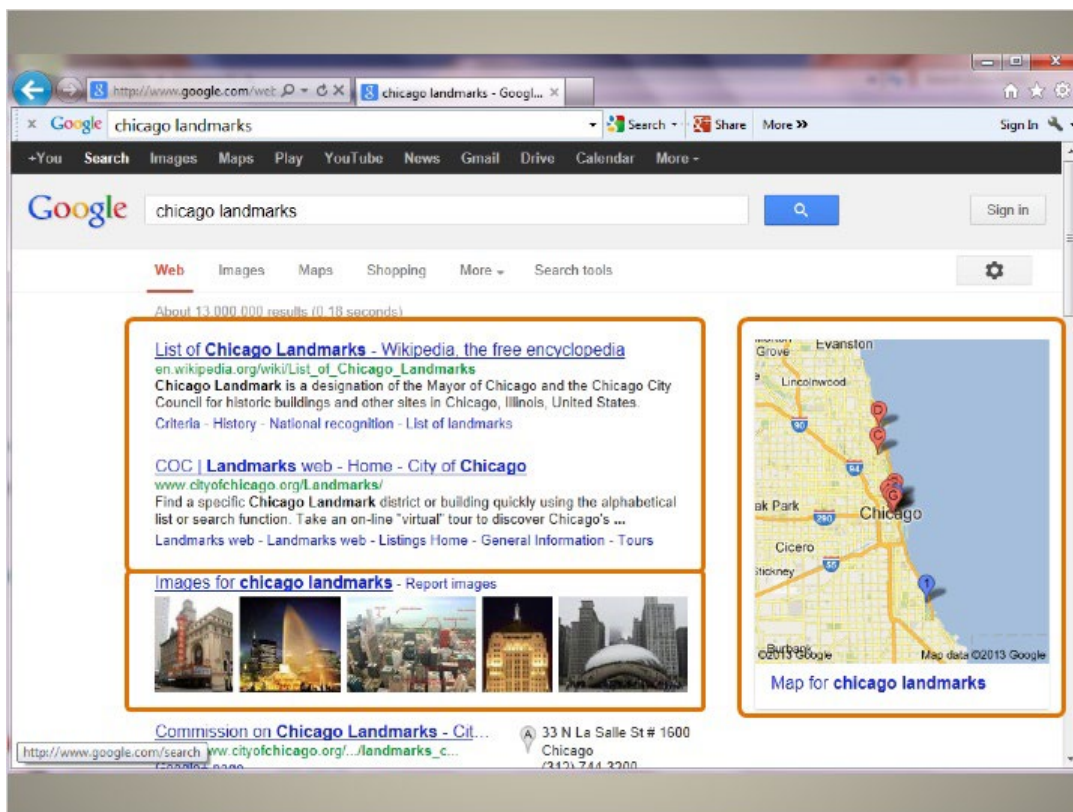
On the Google website she sees a box right below the Google logo, this is where she will type in what she wants to search for.

2.2 Type In Your Keywords



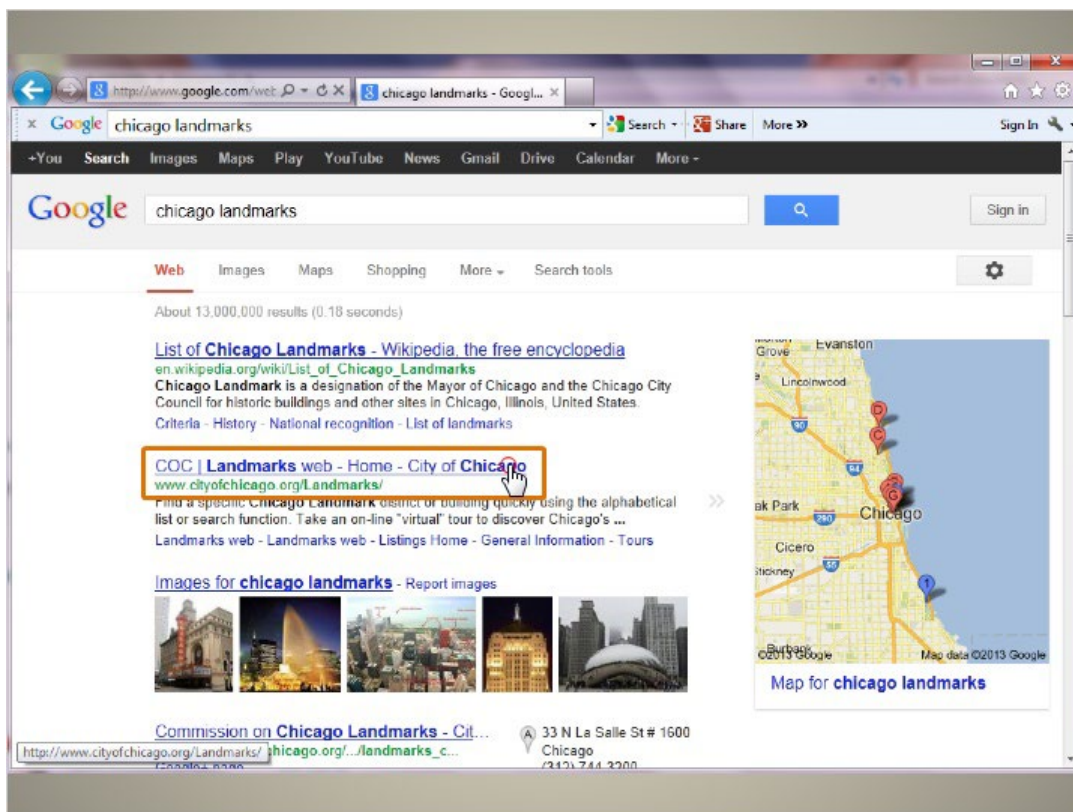
Michelle is interested in visiting some of the well-known landmarks on her trip. So, she types in the keywords “Chicago landmarks”. By default, Google will search for things that include both of these words.

2.3 Google Displays A List Of Results Based On Keywords



As soon as Michelle starts typing Google with display some suggestions for keywords or phrases that other people have used. and results will start to show below. If she wants to use one of the suggested searches, she can select one from the list. Otherwise she can just finish typing her search terms and hit the search button.

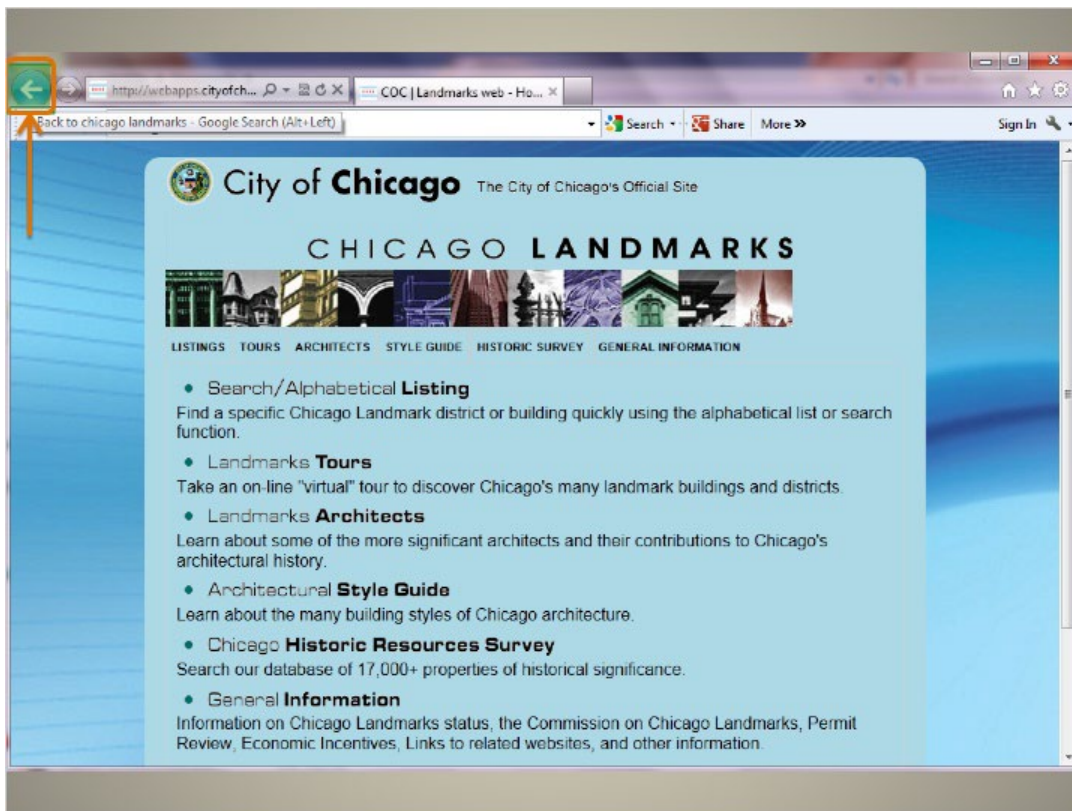
2.3 Click On A Link From The Results List



Google will display a list of results based on Michelle's keywords. When she looks at her results, she sees websites with lists of Chicago landmarks as well as images of those landmarks and a map of where those landmarks are located.

To visit one of the websites that came up as a search result, click the link.

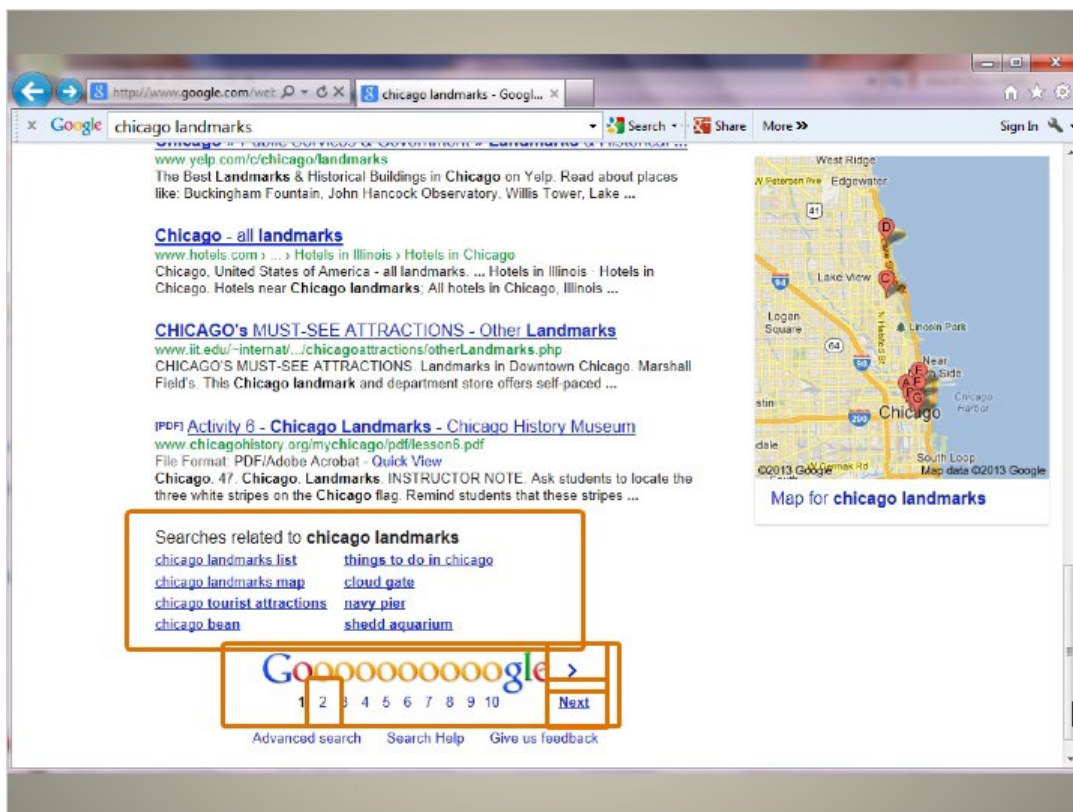
2.4 Go Back To Your Results List



To go back to the search results, Michelle will hit the back browser in the Internet browser. The back button is the left arrow at the top left of the window.

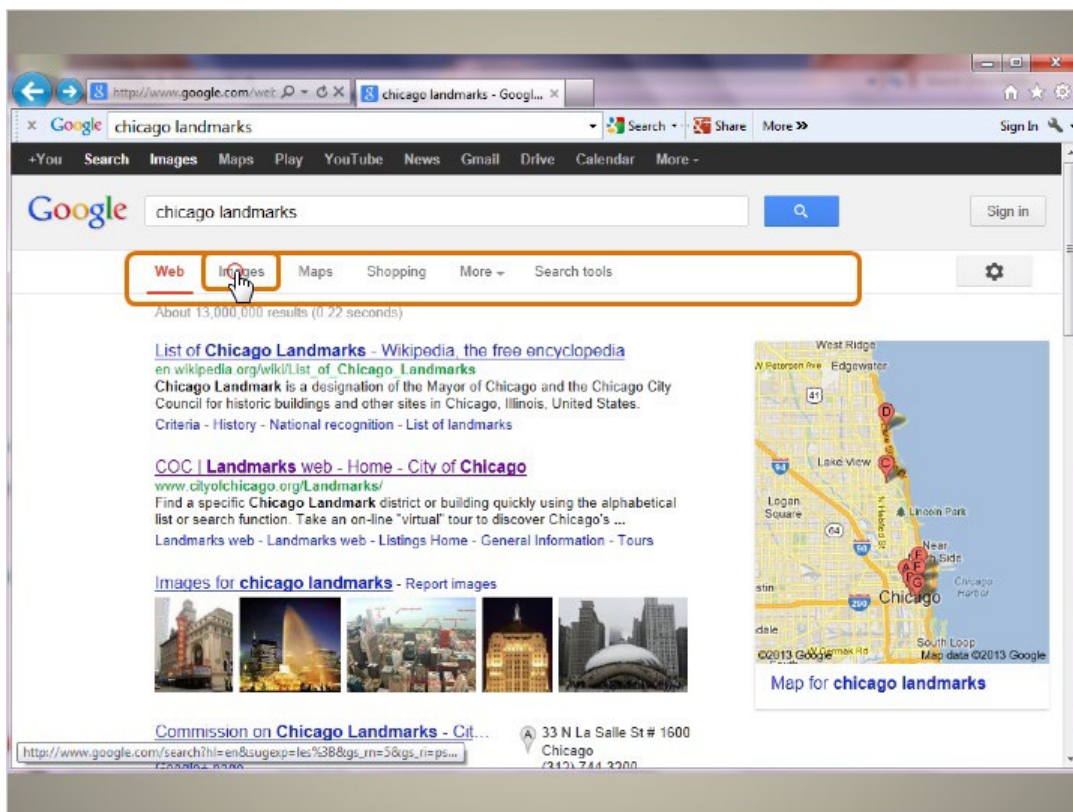
Hit it now to return to the search results.

2.5 Related Searches And More Pages



In order to see more results Michelle scrolls down to the bottom of the page. At the bottom is the “Related to” section. Which displays similar searches you may also want to try. To execute those searches simply click on the search terms. There are also additional pages of results. Clicking “Next” or the “Right” arrow takes you to the next page of results. You can also go to a specific page of results. Now let’s scroll back up to the top.

2.6 You Can Make Your Search Results More Specific



At the top of the page, right above the results, there are tabs to choose what kind of results you want to see. “Web” is the most general, and will display all results from the Internet. The other choices are more specific and will narrow results to the category such as “Images”, “Maps”, and more.

We’ll use the “Image” tab to narrow our results.
